Our research facility and demonstration farm is near Estelline, South Dakota (25 minutes north of Brookings, and 20 minutes south of Watertown).

We are looking for changemakers- those that want to take action to save our place on this planet.

We need transformative changes to our food production systems to produce healthier food profitably while preserving biodiversity and natural resources.

Research positions (these start as 3-6 month positions with potential to extend) will study food systems ecology across the United States, including working with some of the top regenerative farmers in the world. Research includes soils, water, microbes, plants, invertebrates, birds, socioeconomics, and nutrient density. Interns will help maintain the laboratory, greenhouse, and field experiments that pertain to livestock, insects and plants. Maintain livestock, honey bees, and crops in an integrated demonstration farm. Collecting and entering data, maintaining a clean and functioning work environment, skills with microscopes, and strong attention to detail are all part of the job. Must be able to work outside, have good interpersonal skills, and work independently. A valid driver's license and passport is necessary, because we are doing research both locally and nationally. These positions will be working closely with honey bee hives. Experience in Biology, Botany, Soil Science, Agronomy, Natural Resource Management, Ornithology, or Entomology is a big plus.
